Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Steve Ball at 6pm.

Adopt Agenda:

Therese Salazar made the motion to approve the agenda for tonight's meeting and Amy Leach seconded the motion. The board voted in favor of said motion 5-0. Motion declared passed.

Approval of the Minutes:

Amy Leach made the motion to approve the minutes from the March 18, 2024 meeting and Therese Salazar seconded the motion. The board voted in favor of said motion 5-0. Motion declared passed.

Action/Discussion Items:

• Elect Vice Chair Position

 Wende Taylor made the motion to elect Amy Leach as the Vice Chair and Kent Rahn seconded the motion. The board voted in favor of said motion 5-0. Motion declared passed.

Grizzly Field project application review and action

- Steve explained that the application was submitted last month there were a few
 questions so the board requested that representation from the Youth Rugby/Football
 organizations be present at this months meeting.
- Cathy shared that there were questions that needed to be asked of Wayne in the Inspection and Zoning department. Wayne presented Ron with an email that the project cannot be signed off on until an architect looks over to make sure it meets codes.
- Ron explained the project will be broken down into 3 phases.
 - 1. Suitable space to play on
 - Would like to move the field
 - Ron commented that the field stays
 - Goal posts would need to be moved about 4 ft
 - Lou Rich may donate new goal posts
 - New posts will be powder coated white
 - Old goal posts belong to Grizzly Football program
 - 2. Secure safe equipment storage
 - Easier to have one space for equipment to be held especially with different coaches
 - Needing to move the trailer to where the teams are practicing
 - Able to have a safe and secure space for players to change before the game
 - 3 shipping storage containers that will be put together, with 2 at ground level and one raised
 - Ron shared that they will replace the shipping container doors with a rollup garage type door
 - Ron shared that there will be locks on facilities to make sure people can't break into
 - There will be no facilities in building just a building to allow people to change
 - There is no need for water, electric sewer
 - 3. Space for spectators to sit
 - Current bleachers would be put on a crushed rock or concrete slab that does not need to be mowed under. Right now they are moved to mow
 - Will use existing bleachers instead of building new
- Currently the Rugby program has 20 middle school kids and 35 high schoolers
 - Albert Lea has certified 9 coaches this year
- o Ron is asking to move the project along and do steps 1 and 2
 - Playing field modifications and equipment storage
 - Chris is willing to do the grating work and taking care of berm

- Ron asked that the City make the decision on the rest of the project and what is missing and if doable
- Ron shared that they would want to do a contract with the City to take facilities with instead of starting over from start
- Liability- they are not looking to increase the liability for anyone so willing to look at idea if it will raise liability
 - Could keep all containers on ground level and create pad for a sitting area
- Right now the bleachers at the park are Youth football bleachers
- Ryan shared that Ron and him have talked and the biggest concern is the corner of the field will get into berm
 - Steve is requesting that the level still has a little grade so that the water is able to drain
 - Ron shared that the corner that goes into to berm would need to be grated and flattened out
- Ron asked what could be done for the shoreline since the beavers have taken care of it and it needs to be redone
- Steve looked at plans and seems to be ok from the parks end
- Cathy asked what the storage containers will look like
 - Ron shared they would be reconditioned and be painted a matte grey color so they can age well
 - There will be logos on that can be sponsorship that can be replaced as it ages
 - The idea would be to make it look like it was built for the use of being on the field
- o At this time the group does have a good amount of money ear marked for the project
- Motion: The board recommends moving forward with the playing field modifications as presented by Albert lea Youth Football, Albert Lea Grizzly program and Albert Lea Rugby and as funded by the above organizations. Motion made by Amy Leach and seconded by Therese Salazar. The board voted in favor of said motion 5-0. Motion declared passed.
- Motion: The board recommends the council approve placement of 2 shipping containers for equipment storage for 3 organizations as long as they meet building code and local ordinance. Motion made by Wende Taylor and seconded by Therese Salazar. The board voted in favor of said motion 5-0. Motion declared passed.

Rec facilities referendum results and next steps

- o Referendum passed! 3 to 1 1,849 yes 600 no
- Cathy shared statistics on the election
- Next step is the contract going to City Council on Monday
 - 1st contract is for the refrigeration for the Nystrom and Colstrup rinks
 - 2nd contract is for the rest of the project
 - Parks is doing the downtown bathroom that is not under the direction of APEX
- Steve asked when work will start
 - Bob shared that this year will be for planning and then next spring the work will start

- 1st phase- design then council will look at bids and decide what they will do and then will amend the contract for the implication
- Splash Pad Bathrooms
 - Ryan is working on what they want for designs and plans with dollar amount
- o Projects will come through Park and Rec board before going to council
