- The Recreation Department held a groundbreaking ceremony for the City Arena remodeling on May 1. Amy Leach of the Parks and Recreation attended, along with representatives of the Albert Lea Hockey Association, Waldorf University, InBylt, Brennan Construction, City of Albert Lea staff, and Mayor Rich Murray and Councilor Larry Baker. The Albert Lea Tribune, KIMT TV 3, KTTC TV 10 and KAAL TV 6 all covered the event.
- The Shell Rock River Watershed District treated parts of Fountain Lake May 7-9 with an herbicide to suppress curly-leaf pondweed, an invasive plant species. The district asked people to stay out of the water for 24 hours after the application out of an abundance of caution.
- Freeborn County recently announced its first \$1 million grant developing the Song Bird Trail on the abandoned Union Pacific Railroad line from Albert Lea to Hartland. The grant is from MnDOT's Active Transportation Program and will fund the first portion of the trail from Fountain Street to Manchester, except for the crossing at Minnesota Highway 13 estimated at \$3.8 million. The total estimate to build the trail from Albert Lea to Austin, including a bridge or tunnel to cross Highway 13, is about \$8 million.
- The Albert Lea Senior Center Board voted May 14 to recommend the City of Albert Lea seek proposals to improve access to the current Senior Center facility in the Skyline Plaza or move it to a new location. The Recreation Department oversees the Senior Center, renting space at Skyline Plaza and contracting the Albert Lea Family Y to operate the center. While the Center offers excellent programming, access is challenging due to the poor condition of the parking lot and lack of automatic doors. The Center has 270 members with 165 checking in at least once in the last month. The age range is from 55 to 100 years, with 81 years young being the median age. Members come from all over with 39 or 14% coming from outside the City of Albert Lea,

including Alden, Blooming Prairie, Bricelyn, Clarks Grove, Conger, Ellendale, Emmons, Glenville, Hartland, New Richland, Owatonna, Wells, Northwood and even Mason City.
