Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Steve Ball at 6:00pm.

Adopt Agenda:

Wende Taylor made the motion to approve the agenda for tonight's meeting and Kent Rahn seconded the motion. The board voted in favor of said motion 4-0 (Amy Leach absent for vote). Motion declared passed.

Approval of the Minutes:

Wende Taylor made the motion to approve the minutes from the April 21, 2025 (May meeting was cancelled) meeting and Therese Salazar seconded the motion. The board voted in favor of said motion 4-0 (Amy Leach absent for vote). Motion declared passed.

Public Items:

Communications coordinator, Teresa Kauffman, was present to take pictures of the board members for use on the new City website.

Mayor Rich Murray was also in attendance to thank the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board on a job well done for their work and dedication to the board. Parks are huge in our community and the new construction and projects at the City Arena are exciting for all.

Old Business Items:

Review and updates of Rec Facilities Referendum Projects -City Arena

Lobby -

- The roof demo will take place on the 18 and 19. This will be where the old lobby and office area get tied into the new lobby.
- Work will begin on the new roof for the lobby area on June 22.
- Blockwork for lobby windows will be done this week.
- July 1 brickwork will take place for about ten days.

Interior Lobby and Office area -

- Jim and Dudes will start roughing in for HVAC and plumbing.
- Albert Lea electric finish rough-ins for electric next two weeks.
- June 18 install begins for door frames and sheetrock in the office area. Work expected to be complete June 23, with painting starting after July 4.
- June 26 install begins for new rooftop units, entry, office area, and Colstrup locker rooms.
- Windows and glass doors are to be installed in the early part of August.

Colstrup Arena Refrigeration and Floor -

- This week, they are installing a drain tile and sump system to keep water from the arena floor and refrigeration piping.
- Next week, the refrigeration contractor will start welding the main pies from the refrigeration unit to the arena floor.
- June 30 to July 8 they will begin to import sand into the rink.
- July 9 they will work to level and compact sand for the arena floor.
- July 14 install of equipment begins in the equipment room for 24 days.
- Mechanical room piping work will begin Jul 14.
- August 4 compressors will be set.
- Sept 12 work will begin for the rink floor pour.
- System startup is set for Oct 27.
- Over the next two weeks, Bob will be starting plans for temporary chillers to get the ice in as soon as possible.
- Bob will also contact all the user groups as soon as he can get some firmer dates.

Aquatic Center

- The boilers are up and running. We have a problem with gas regulators, but we are working that out with Minnesota Energy.
- Construction for the new entrance and admission building will begin at the end of August.

Marion Ross Theatre

- Working with Harris Mechanical on more straightforward controls for ACT to use.
- Windows to be installed in late July.

New Business Items:

Cathy presented information to the board about the City's new website that is set to launch on June 24th. There are still corrections being made and staff will continue to work on adjusting things as they come up.

Ryan presented the potential cost and the amount the City would be asking for the associations to provide for the concessions portion. - New website: The City of Albert Lea plans to launch a revamped website on June 24 that is more secure and easier to use. While the new site will have the same address at cityofalbertlea.org, the test site is ready for review and comment. The new site includes a directory of parks, trails and fun spots. Please visit the test site and email any corrections or suggestions to Cathy Malakowsky at cmalakowsky@ci.albertlea.mn.us. Other new features include accessibility features such as bigger text for browsers with visual impairments, a staff directory, translation into other languages such as Spanish and online submissions for Public Works issues such as streetlight outages and potholes.
- Blazing Star State Trail: The contractor is making progress on building the bridge to extend the
 <u>Blazing Star State Trail</u> between Myre-Big Island State Park and Hayward. After pausing work to
 allow the bridge foundation to settle, crews recently resumed work. This Minnesota
 Department of Natural Resources project is slated for completion late this year.

Council supports grant to restore channel: The Albert Lea City Council voted May 12 to support
the Shell Rock River Watershed District's grant application for restoring the channel between
Fountain and Albert Lea lakes. The <u>watershed district</u> is seeking more funding for the proposed
project from the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council. This project would help reduce
erosion, improve accessibility, and build upon past funding to improve lake water quality and
habitat.

Referendum Project Updates

Aquatic Center

- Electric will be completed on Friday for exterior lighting.
- Construction on the new ticket booth and entrance will start in September 2025.

City Arena

- Excavating for the under-ice tile and sump pump in the compressor room and under the rink floor continues.
- Albert Lea Electric continues to update the building's wiring and add transformers.
- Steel beams, bar joists, and decking for the new lobby are complete, and the masons have started laying the block.
- Framers are working in the Recreation office and new lobby.
- Interior masonry is ongoing in the new referee room.
- Solar panels continue to be installed in the Colstrup arena.

Board Member Items:

Steve Ball – Inquired about how we can get the word about Ginkle Park and how to access it since it is located in a more secluded area.

Amy Leach – Amy asked staff about the curb cut-out near the east entrance to Edgewater park for access from the sidewalk across Lakeview Boulevard to the park. Staff assured her that the work will be done, the timeline is just uncertain at this point.

Jason Howland – Jason discussed ash trees with the Parks staff and how they are addressed the private vs public trees that need to be either treated or removed. Staff informed him that when a tree becomes hazardous and is on private property, they will send a letter to the home owner and allow 30 days for them to take care of the issue. After 30 days another letter will be sent and they are given 7 days as a final warning. At this time the City will hire a company to do the work and the home owner will be assessed for the expense.

Adjournment: Amy Leach made a motion to adjourn the Park Board meeting and Kent Rahn seconded the motion. The board voted in favor of said motion 3-0 (Wende and Theresa were absent). Motion declared passed. Meeting adjourned.
