Both meet all setbacks and the applicants passed background checks. The council declined to reconsider a registration

- for a local applicant because of concerns over the applicant's criminal record, probation violations and recent actions.
- The council also discussed adding a background check beyond the state licensing process and raising the current limit of 2 non-tribal retailers.
